

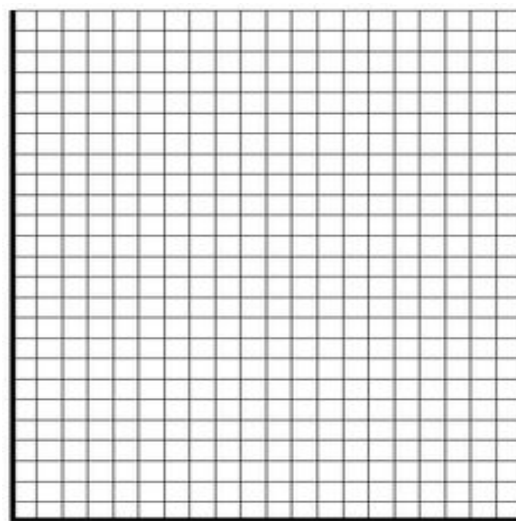

Riemann Sum	$\int_a^b f(x) dx = \lim_{n \rightarrow \infty} \sum_{i=1}^n f(x_i^*) \Delta x$ $\Delta x = \frac{b-a}{n}; \quad n = \text{the number of subintervals}$
Fundamental Theorem of Calculus (Part 1)	$F(x) = \int_a^b f(x) dx = F(b) - F(a)$
